Dubadah Boldeau - East End Lighthouse

Dubadah came to Cayman at age 3 and is an architect by trade, volunteering her services to the National Trust in the reconstruction of Mission House in 2007. She is a self-taught visual artist, working primarily in watercolour.

The East End Lighthouse is one of the lesser known landmarks in Grand Cayman, being one of only two lighthouses on the island. The structure was built in 1918 and actively served mariners sailing through the eastern channel in Gun Bay with the kerosene light being seen 10 miles out to sea. The lighthouse served until 1937.
